Many brush and hardwood species will resprout vigorously when cut. Also, invasive species love finding new places to grow in disturbed soil. Some follow up examples can be application of herbicide, grazing, prescribed fire, or dedicated hand work. To help make a plan and receive professional assistance with these follow-up treatments you can also enroll in cost- share programs such as EQIP or CFIP, or participate in the Prescribed Burn Association. What would you like to do to keep your property fire safe for years to come?
